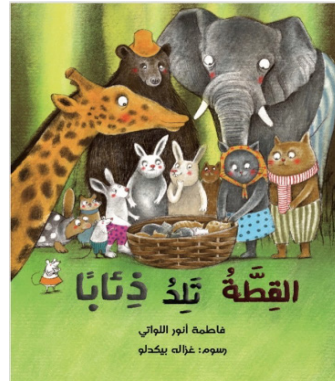
The Cat Give Birth to the Wolf

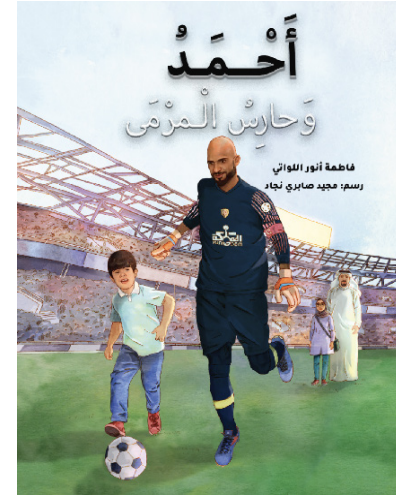
The Floating Bubble
